CONNECTICUT AIRPORT AUTHORITY ADVISES BRADLEY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT PASSENGERS OF BUSY THANKSGIVING TRAVEL PERIOD

WINDSOR LOCKS, CONNECTICUT – **November 21, 2016** – Bradley International Airport (BDL) will experience a very heavy travel period this week due to the Thanksgiving holiday.

Kevin A. Dillon, A.A.E., Executive Director of the Connecticut Airport Authority, advises that Bradley passengers should be aware and plan accordingly.

"The key during this busy travel week is to give yourself extra time and to plan ahead," says Dillon. "Our team will do everything we can to make your travel through the airport as carefree as possible."

Passengers traveling domestically are advised to allow themselves at least 90 minutes for check in with their respective airlines and processing through the TSA screening. Those traveling internationally should give themselves three hours.

Additionally, passengers are encouraged to follow these tips during this peak travel period:

- 1. Check and confirm the status of your flight with your airline prior to your departure for the Airport.
- 2. Visit www.flybdl.org to familiarize yourself with Bradley's parking options and terminal facilities.
